When you sign up you'll find heaps of great downloadable tools to help you, including: invitations, thank you cards, Facebook cover photos, and more!


Young parents Nicola and Brad Thomson decided to gift their son's first birthday to Starship as a thank

"THANK YOU FOR HELPING POPPY COME HOME," SAYS MUM, ESTELLE.

Do you remember little Poppy?

She was just three months old when she had a cardiac arrest and had to be rushed to Starship from her home in Hamilton. Poppy was diagnosed with a dangerous and chronic heart condition called Dilated Cardiomyopathy.

"A third of children with cardiomyopathy slowly deteriorate and die," Poppy's mum, Estelle remembers being told. *"That's when it hit us that our daughter could die."*

Her only hope was the incredible round the clock care guaranteed by our dedicated teams and facilities at Starship's Paediatric Intensive Care Unit (PICU). Poppy's life hung in the balance for weeks and there were many ups and downs. At one point she even suffered another cardiac arrest.

But thanks to amazing supporters like you, our PICU team had the vital equipment they needed to keep her alive. And thanks again to you and all the wonderful supporters who helped raise over \$180,000 towards our appeal featuring Poppy's story, we will also be able to buy most of the equipment we need, including pressure relief mattresses, an ECMO trainer and other essential equipment.

Poppy's doctors and nurses fought long and hard for her, and after an immense 237 day battle to get well, Poppy finally went home with her mum and dad. She's been back home for 13 weeks now and is doing really well. In fact she's learning how to walk.

"We are very grateful to be home with Poppy," says Estelle. *"She's become very interactive and her development hasn't been too greatly affected despite her length of stay in the hospital. I don't think it will be long before she starts to walk! She loves playing with her older brother and sister and they love having her around."*

We take each day as it comes. Some days are harder than others but it's much easier now that we're together as a family. For now Poppy's condition is stable and her future is promising."

"Starship is amazing," Estelle continues. *"The amount of care that went into getting Poppy to where she is now has blown me away. The doctors are incredible, the nurses are incredible, everything about Starship is amazing. I'm so grateful."*

And so are we. So we want to send a huge thank you out to every single one of you who helped support Poppy's appeal.

That said, we still need a little more help to reach our target of \$235,000 to buy all the equipment we urgently need. So if you are able to make an extra gift today, please do. Your kindness means the world to our little patients and their families.

THE NUTS AND BOLTS OF LEAVING A BEQUEST TO STARSHIP.

In our third and final instalment of our series on legacy giving, we discuss how to include Starship in your Will.

More and more of our committed supporters are appreciating the profound value and benefit of leaving a gift to Starship in their Wills. And more and more are becoming Guardian Angels by letting us know they've done so.

Making a Will is not about death... it's about your life. **What do you want to be remembered for?**

We are so grateful to all of our Guardian Angels. But if you have not yet taken this step yourself, you might be wondering what's involved? And how do you even go about including Starship Foundation in your Will?

The first point to stress, is that it's much easier than you might think. And the second, is that your loved ones must come first. With that in mind, here's our three step guide...

Step One: Talk to your loved ones. Discuss your plans with your family and friends first. Tell them why Starship is important to you and why you want to leave us a gift in your Will. Let them know that

they will be taken care of first and foremost. That way there will be no surprises when the time comes.

Step Two: Talk to your solicitor. Call and tell them you want to leave a gift to Starship in your Will. It's that simple. They do it all the time. They will ask you what type of gift you want to leave: Residual, Percentage or Pecuniary (see right), and how much. If you already have a Will you can easily add a codicil (an amendment). If you don't, they can prepare one for you.

Step Three: Talk to us. Letting us know of your intentions will help us to thank you and share with you the impact that your gift will have. And you will automatically become one of our treasured Guardian Angels - a special group of people who have pledged to look after the health and well-being of future generations of children. Contact Karen Blake, our Bequest Officer for a confidential, no-obligation chat about your bequest plans, how it will make a difference, and what steps to take.

Become a Guardian Angel, and you'll be watching over New Zealand's little ones long after you're gone.

3 KINDS OF LEGACY GIFTS

There are three different types of legacy gift you can make, they are:

A Percentage Gift: You decide in advance what percentage of your estate you would like to go to the charity or charities of your choice, which means that you're not committed to giving a set amount.

A Pecuniary Gift: You choose a specific sum of money, an item of property, or number of stocks or shares to be left to the charity or charities of your choice.

A Residual Gift: After providing for your loved ones, the remainder of your estate is left to your chosen charity or charities.

DID YOU KNOW?

- Only 40% of New Zealanders have made a Will.
- Bequests like yours ensure we will continue to have first class medical care for our sick and injured children now and into the future.
- Every year Starship's Guardian Angels make a huge contribution to child health in New Zealand.
- It doesn't matter how much or how little you leave – every bequest counts.
- Letting us know of your bequest helps us to thank you and share with you the impact that your gift will have.
