Eczema Flare: Care Plan

<1 year of age

Bath

- Once a day. No soap or bubble bath.
- Use soap-free wash or moisturiser as a soap substitute.

Moisturiser

- Your moisturiser is: (prescriber to circle) Use every day, all over. Sorbolene (cetomacrogol glycerol) Apply morning and night and with every Paraffin 50:50 nappy change. Fatty cream Apply when needed to soothe itch. Non ionic • Can be used instead of soap. Other **Topical Steroid - Face** Your face steroid is: (prescriber to circle)
- Once a day to eczema that is red/darker and itchy.
- Do not use aristocort on eyelids.
- Use plain Vaseline for irritation around the mouth.

Topical Steroid - Body, arms and legs

- Once a day to ALL eczema that is rough, red/darker and itchy.
- You can mix half and half with moisturiser to help it spread over large areas.
- Don't use under the nappy unless told to by your doctor.

Please use steroid on \checkmark **days** (prescriber to circle start day)

	EITHER Use steroid to eczema as needed at the first sign of a flare OR if eczema patches flare often, use steroid as a preventer 2 days a week (Sat & Sunday)

Locoid (hydrocortisone butyrate 0.1%)



Beta (betamethasone valerate 0.1%)



Elocon (mometasone furoate 0.1%)
