Eczema Flare: Care Plan ≥5 years of age

Bath

- Once a day. No soap or bubble bath.
- Use soap-free wash or moisturiser as a soap substitute.

Moisturiser

- Your moisturiser is: (prescriber to circle) Use every day, all over. Cetomacrogol glycerol (Sorbolene) Apply morning and night and at other times Paraffin 50:50 as often as you like. Fatty cream • Apply when needed to soothe itch. Non ionic • Can be used instead of soap. Other Topical Steroid - Face, neck, groin Your face steroid is: (prescriber to circle) • Once a day to eczema that is red/darker and itchy. 1% hydrocortisone Do not use aristocort on eyelids. Aristocort • If there is no eczema, just moisturise. Topical Steroid - Body, arms and legs Your body steroid is: (prescriber to circle) Once a day to ALL eczema that is rough, Locoid red/darker and itchy.
 - You can mix half and half with moisturiser to help it spread over large areas.

Please use steroid on days (prescriber to circle start day)
