# Eczema Flare: Care Plan ≥5 years of age

#### **Bath**

- Once a day. No soap or bubble bath.
- Use soap-free wash or moisturiser as a soap substitute.

#### Moisturiser

- Use every day, all over.
- Apply morning and night and at other times as often as you like.
- Apply when needed to soothe itch.
- Can be used instead of soap.

## Topical Steroid - Face, neck, groin

- Once a day to eczema that is red/darker and itchy.
- Do not use aristocort on eyelids.
- If there is no eczema, just moisturise.

#### Your face steroid is: (prescriber to circle)

# **Topical Steroid - Body, arms and legs**

- Once a day to ALL eczema that is rough, red/darker and itchy.
- You can mix half and half with moisturiser to help it spread over large areas.
